RSWNY members read their work at ImageArt Poetry Reading

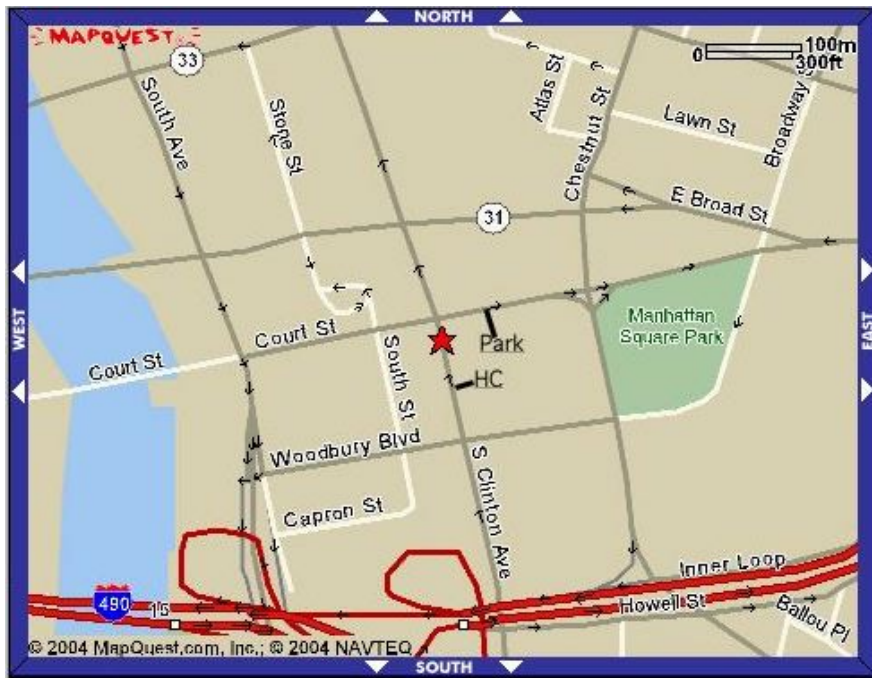
